

Musana Summer Internship Application 2026

Musana's internship program is a unique opportunity for students, young professionals, or anyone with a hunger to learn from the amazing people of Uganda! Utilizing Musana's development model, this internship program provides the chance to see what our values of local ownership, social entrepreneurship, sustainability, and accountability look like in practice in a community like Iganga, Uganda. Musana's incredible Ugandan leadership is daily taking strides towards transforming their community, breaking the dependency mindset, and teaching the community to BE their own catalysts for change. Our interns work alongside our local leaders and staff to experience and learn from them!

With less emphasis on task-oriented projects, this internship program focuses more on cultural emersion, building relationships, and exposure to the greatest social issues in Uganda. Our interns automatically build on their own skills and talents by engaging with different perspectives and approaches...possibly finding their own ideas transform!

Past interns have come from various backgrounds in areas that include education, medical, public health, physical and occupational therapy, dentistry, and social work, with very different professional paths, they had one common interest - a desire to listen and learn from local initiative!

The goals for this program include, but are not limited to:

- ✓ Immersing you in Musana's community development program, established in Iganga, Uganda.
- ✓ Utilizing your strengths to continue and improve Musana's service within the community.
- ✓ Building upon our opportunity to provide continued and potentially new self-sustainability projects within our organization.
- ✓ An opportunity to grow personally, mentally, interpersonally, and spiritually as you serve in a foreign environment
- ✓ Inspiring you to live a life of service and love, regardless of whether you serve on local or foreign soil.

Requirements for Application:

- Applicants must be **21** years of age or older (if you are not 21, we will look at applications on a case-by-case basis for applicants 18-20 years of age.)
- Complete application packet online (current resume, three references-1 personal and 2 work-related, and three essays) by December 7, 2025.
- Current passport or passport application in process.
- Complete 3 essays, no more than 500 words per essay. Please answer the following questions:
 - □ What events, thoughts, and feelings have led you to the point of wanting to apply for this internship?

	☐ How has your worldview been shaped up until now and how do you expect it to change and/or grow with this internship?
	☐ How do you view this trip as part of your life-long growth as a person, servant, and leader?

	hen traveling, and for a brief time living, to/in a completely foreign country, can often be frustrating as you e plugged into a different way of life. As an intern at Musana, it is important that you are a person who is:
	Extremely open-minded and accepting of different ways of doing things even though it may not be how you see things and/or would do things.
	PATIENT-no matter what, but especially when things don't happen how and when you would like.
	Willing to brainstorm and implement ideas in a way that respects the people, staff, and culture of which you are living and working.
	Capable of adapting to situations that may feel uncomfortable (Situations may challenge you spiritually, physically, and or emotionally.)
	Comfortable being different from the rest of the community. As a foreigner, you may be prone to being stared at, laughed at, and possibly harassed (especially as a female).
	Self-motivated to implement ideas and not give up despite the obstacles that may arise.
	Adaptable to the change of climate and diet, and able to stay positive even though you may be tired and hot
	Strong and patient when faced with corruption, being cheated, manipulated, or treated unfairly.
	Respectful of the culture, including refraining from behaviors that may be normal at home but seen as offensive in Uganda (walking while eating, ignoring people you pass by, or flirting carelessly).
	The summer internship program costs \$6000, all-inclusive and includes, round-trip airfare, home stay meals, Visa, travel insurance, cell phone and in-country Internet coverage (for your work in Iganga, not personal coverage.) Interns are encouraged to plan for additional expenses, like local transportation, personal cell phone coverage, personal in-country Internet, entertainment, meals at Sol View, other snacks, and any weekend travel experiences (like hiking Sipi Falls or trips to Jinja.)

IMPORTANT Information:

PASSPORT:

We highly encourage anyone who is seriously considering a Musana internship to apply for your passport immediately. To obtain a passport you will need a certified birth certificate (not the hospital record), two passport photos, and a driver's license. In addition, you will need to pick up and fill out a form from the post office and turn in the information to a postal clerk for processing with the U. S. Passport Agency. This process can cost up to \$150.00. Even if this program does not work for you, having your passport is a good idea, wherever your travels may take you in years to come. Passport processing takes several weeks. If you currently have your passport, be certain to check the expiration dates to confirm the effectiveness of your passport for the duration of this program

DEPOSIT AND BALANCE:

The non-refundable application deposit is due with your application. The acceptance deposit is due for verification of your intent. If your fundraising does not cover the costs associated with this program, you will be expected to pay the balance.

IMMUNIZATIONS:

Check the website for the U.S. Center for Disease Control for recommended vaccinations. Vaccinations and medicines are not included in the cost of the internship. Plan anywhere from \$100.00 to \$900.00. Contact your local travel clinic or choose any other provider and plan at least 4 - 6 weeks before your internship to allow time for shots to take effect. Please be sure to keep a copy of your immunization records with you while you travel. Required vaccinations and medication: Tetanus/Diphtheria, and Yellow Fever immunizations (required for admittance back into the States). Contact your physician on the International Travel Clinic for further information. If there is a vaccine for Corona Virus, it will be required to travel to Musana.

Recommended vaccinations: Hepatitis A & B, Measles/Mumps/Rubella, **Malaria medication**, and Travelers Diarrhea prescribed medicine. Uganda: http://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/destinations/uganda.html

UGANDAN VISA:

The Ugandan visa process is changing. Check https://visas.immigration.go.ug/ for the most up to date costs and procedures. We will be purchasing Visas online before you trip.

HOUSING:

An element of our internship program is a cultural immersion experience. Therefore, interns will be staying throughout the summer with host families. These families are local Ugandans who live in the Iganga community. They will be chosen by Musana's leadership and will provide housing and most of your meals. Interns will have their own bed and access to clean water. Note: To ensure the safety of interns, accommodation by host families is subject to change. Depending on situations in Uganda or any other circumstances out of our control, Musana may choose to have you stay at our guesthouse, located at Musana headquarters.

I am offering my services knowingly and voluntarily, with no expectation or promise of any form of compensation or remuneration, either directly or indirectly from Musana Community Development Organization. My motivation for providing such services is solely the personal satisfaction I may enjoy from helping those at the Musana Community Development Organization. I am providing my services solely as a volunteer.

I am volunteering for this trip. I understand that I am not entitled to receive any wages or other benefits for my services. I am not covered by any workers' compensation program in performing these services; and, if injured on this trip, I will not be entitled to workers' compensation medical, death or indemnity benefits under Colorado's compensation law.

Because I am volunteering for this trip, I understand that I am not covered by any medical insurance, life insurance, any other insurance or indemnity benefits in performing these services; and if injured during the trip, I and my heirs and representatives, will not be entitled to medical insurance, life insurance, other insurance and indemnity benefits. I certify that I have sufficient health insurance to cover any bodily injury and/or bodily damage I may incur while during the trip. If I have no insurance, I certify that I will personally pay for all such medical expenses and liabilities.

Release, Waiver of Liability and Indemnification

POLICIES & PROCEDURES:

If you are interested in participating in Musana's internship program, please read the following and initial.

- No one will be considered or accepted as a team member until a completed application (and all appropriate documents) and deposit are received.
- You must submit this completed application AND a non-refundable \$100.00 deposit before your application will be processed and reviewed. This check will be deposited in the bank immediately. In the event your application is not accepted, your deposit will be transferred to Musana's general fund.
- Participants must adhere to rules outlined in the intern covenant. Please read it before applying.
- Your application will be reviewed, and a personal interview will be required. You will be notified by Susie Knight.
- Internships can be rewarding and life changing; however, they can also be stressful. Please consider factors in your personal life at this time that may distract and prohibit you from fully committing to the mission of the internship and adapting to unusual conditions.
- Once accepted, interns are expected to participate in all Skype or phone calls, as scheduled. Each team
 member must also attend any mandatory training prior to departure and after your return for debriefing
 meetings.
- All internship costs are the **intern's** responsibility and due two weeks prior to departure. Once you have been accepted, you will be provided with suggested ways to raise financial support; however, if full support is not raised, **the balance is your responsibility**. You may not begin to raise funds until you are notified of acceptance to the team and informed of proper fundraising procedures.
- If you are unable to participate in your internship, Musana must receive cancellation notice as soon as possible. Monies put towards your internship are contributions, and the Internal Revenue Service prohibits the refund of contributions. Excess fundraising will either be credited toward other interns, as needed, or toward Musana's general fund.
- Interns will be responsible for obtaining information regarding passports and vaccination recommendations from the Department of Health. Passport and vaccination costs are not included in the internship costs and are the responsibility of the intern. Interns assume the responsibility and liability for their personal health decisions.
- Applicants release the use of all forms of media representing program participation including photo, video, voice, and remarks for print, web, and all other forms of media.
- Applicant waives the right to view all references regarding Musana's internship applicant, keeping all comments of reference forms confidential.

Dates, Cost and Travel Information:

Musana will host a 6-week summer internship, departure in early-June and return mid-July. Musana will accept no more than 10 interns per summer who will train together in the States and serve together in Uganda at one of our campuses.

Musana Internship Cost:

Please consider the cost before applying for Musana's internship program. The cost for Musana's internship program is \$6000

This amount covers the following expenses for this program:

- Roundtrip airfare and travel insurance
- Lodging in Uganda (and any other overnight stays as dictated by flight schedules)
- Roundtrip transportation to and from the airport, work related internet and cell phones
- Most of your meals will be provided by your host family/guesthouse. You will be considered part of their family and should plan to eat when they eat unless you are at Musana working.
- Musana sponsored activities

Any funds that are raised above and beyond the cost of the internship will be considered a donation to Musana. Any funds not raised are the responsibility of the intern and due 14 days before departure.

Payment schedule:

- Non-refundable application fee of \$100 when you turn in your application
- Acceptance down payment of \$100 to hold your spot as a 2026 intern for Musana (non-refundable.) Due within one week of notification as a Musana intern.
- First 1/2 of payment—Due two months before departure date \$3000.00
- Second 1/2 of payment—Due by May 24, 2026 \$2900.00

Mandatory Training Schedule:

Training sessions will be held to prepare interns as individuals and as a team to serve at Musana. Special emphasis will be given to cross-cultural living, team building, working strategies and expectations of interns while in Uganda. Completion of all training material is *MANDATORY*.

Monthly Check-In Meetings will be short and are designed to check in on fundraising and learn about poverty through a book called, <u>Teach a Man to Fish.</u>

Training will be held in Colorado on May 31, 2026, and June 1, 2026. All interns are expected to travel to Colorado for the training if they are out of state. Interns and the Engagement Officer will depart for Uganda from Colorado on Tuesday June 2, 2026. Training in Uganda will also be held on June 5, 2026, and a service day in Uganda on June 6, 2026.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

Musana's Engagement Officer will take care of your itinerary (air fare, transportation and host family/guesthouse living.)

In addition, Musana does not provide money for snacks, souvenirs, personal products and items, airtime for phones, internet on campus or transportation for activities other than those directed by Musana. We encourage interns to allot an additional \$30-35 per week for weekly incidentals, plus any extra money for souvenirs and gifts.

Many Musana visitors enjoy exploring Uganda and the surrounding countries of Africa. Please plan accordingly if this is of interest to you. While Musana can suggest different areas to visit and modes of transportation, we will not cover any extra travel initiated by interns or help cover other incidental weekly costs if extra spending money is consumed by tourist activities and travel.

Fundraising is an integral part of your internship experience. Don't let money keep you from applying for the Musana Internship. Fundraising guidelines and materials will be provided.
